WHEREAS, certain areas of Kawkawlin Township are subject to periodic flooding, mudslides (i.e., mudflows), or flood-related erosion, causing serious damages to properties within these areas; and

WHEREAS, relief is available in the form of Federally subsidized flood insurance as authorized by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this board to require the recognition and evaluation of flood, mudslide (i.e., mudflow), or flood-related erosion hazards in all official actions relating to land use in areas having these hazards; and

WHEREAS, this body has the legal authority to adopt land use and control measures to reduce future flood losses pursuant to Michigan Act 246 of 1945, as amended, Michigan Act 245 of 1929 as amended, Michigan Act 288 of 1967, as amended, (The Subdivision Control Act), and Michigan Act 245 of 1970, as amended (The Shoreland Management and Protection Act) and pursuant to the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, as amended, and regulations promulgated thereunder.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this BOARD, hereby:

- 1. Assures the Federal Insurance Administration that it will enact as necessary, and maintain in force in those areas having flood, mudslide (i.e., mudflow), or flood-related erosion hazards, adequate land use and control measures with effective enforcement provisions consistent with the Criteria set forth in Section 1910 of the National Flood Insurance Program Regulations; and
- 2. Vests the Zoning Administrator with the responsibility, authority, and means to:
- (a) Assist the Administrator, at his request, in his delineation of the limits of the area having special flood, mudslide, (i.e., mudflow), or flood-related erosion hazards.
- (b) Provide such information as the Administrator may request concerning present uses and occupancy of the flood plain, mudslide (i.e., mudflow) or flood-related erosion areas.
- (c) Cooperate with Federal, State, and local agencies and private firms which undertake to study, survey, map, and identify flood plain, mudslide (i.e., mudflow), or flood-related erosion areas, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining flood plain, mudslide(i.e., mudflow) and/or flood-related erosion areas in order to prevent aggravation of existing hazards.
- (d)Submit on the anniversary date of the community's initial eligibility an annual report to the Administrator on the progress made during the past year within the community in the development and implementation of flood plain management measures.
- (e) Upon occurrence, notify the Administrator in writing whenever the boundaries of the community have been modified by annexation or the community has otherwise assumed or no longer has authority to adopt and enforce floodplain management regulations for a particular area. In order that all Flood Hazard Boundary Maps and Flood Insurance Rate Maps accurately represent the community's boundaries, include within such notification a

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copy of a map of the community suitable for reproduction, clearly delineating the new corporate limits or new area for which the community has assumed or relinquished flood plain management regulatory authority.

- 3. Appoints the Zoning Administrator to maintain for public inspection and to furnish upon request, for the determination of applicable flood insurance risk premium rates within all areas having special flood hazards identified on a Flood Hazard Boundary Map or Flood Insurance Rate Map, any certificates of flood-profing, and information on the elevation(in relation to mean sea level) of the level of the lowest habitable floor (including basement if habitable) of all new or substantially improved structures, and include whether or not such structures contain a basement, and if the structure has been floodproofed the elevation (in relation to mean sea level) to which the structure was floodproofed;
- 4. Agrees to take such other official action as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the program.

## AGREEMENT

This agreement between Bourdow Trucking Co., and the Bay County Road Commission will provide for the placing of sand, from the base of the hill to Mosher Road, hauling of stone, certain grading as required, and the placing of a dust pallative on a section of the Seidler Road, from Seven Mile westerly to Eight Mile, approximately 1 mile. This work is being done to provide for the hauling of large amounts of sand from a pit owned by Bourdow Trucking Co.

The initial placement of stone will consist of 2,500 tons which will be hauled by Bourdow Trucking Co. from the Wirt Stone Dock in Bay City. Payment for stone to be made by Kawkawlin Township. The layout of the initial stone will be done by the Road Commission. The new stone and connecting 8 Mile Road will receive an application of 35% liquid calcium chaoride in the amount of not less than 5,000 gallons and will be paid for by Bourdow Trucking Co.

As determined jointly by the Beaver Township Supervisor, Kaw-kawlin Township Supervisor, The Bay County Road Commission, Beaver Road Foreman, and Mr. Daniel Bourdow, based upon need, Bourdow Trucking Co. will place an application of 35% liquie chloride in the amount of 2,500 gallons each application or an acceptable substitute as approved by the Road Commission.

Because of the expected repetitive hauling, grading in excess of normal will be required, Bourdow Trucking Co. further agrees to provide necessary grading on the road as required during the period of time hauling is occurring and immediately after the hauling operation ceases for a period of time.

Further, Bourdow Trucking Co. will provide the necessary liability insurance protecting the Bay County Road Commission for any activity undertaken by Bourdow Trucking Co. on the Seidler Road.

It is anticipated that Eight Mile Road, from the pit entrance to Seidler Road, will serve with only applications of chloride at the present time. Possible reconstruction to the same standards as now being used on Seidler Road, may be required in the future.

At certain times, empty trucks will utilize Eight Mile Road for access to the sand pit. Further, Eight Mile Road will be utilized for the conveyance of loaded trucks during the period of construction of Seidler Road.

Repair of damage to Eight Mile Road during the course of hauly ing will be paid by Bourdow Trucking Co.

All work relative to the reconstruction of Seidler Road shall be completed by June 15, 1979.



BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that when a criminal action is commenced against an officer or employee of Kawkawlin Township based upon the conduct of the officer or employee in the course of employment, if the employee or officer had a reasonable basis for believing that he or she was acting within the scope of his or her authority at the time of the alleged conduct, the Township of Kawkawlin shall pay for, engage, or furnish the services of an attorney to advise the officer or employee as to the action, and appear for and represent the officer or employee in the action.
